Welcome to Cairns and the 30th International Conference on Photonic, Electronic and Atomic Collisions (ICPEAC XXX)!

ICPEAC 2017 started on a high note, with cockatoos, crocodiles and didgeridoos at the reception. (See overleaf for photos!)



ICPEAC 2017 kicked off with the first of the Student Tutorial Lectures by Barry Schneider, who took us back to the early development of computational techniques for studying atomic and molecular structures, and progressing through to modern algorithmic approaches.

He was followed by Thomas Pfeifer, with a talk on the impact of strong laser fields on the spatial and spectroscopic characteristics of atoms and molecules.

The final talk by Chris Greene discussed multichannel quantum defect theory (MQDT), used to describe the low angular momentum states of an alkali-metal atom, and the expansions for describing atomic and molecular Rydberg states, to examine complex resonances and the Fermi pseudopotential.

Welcome to Country

The Welcome to Country is an important Australian cultural practice, in which we acknowledge the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the traditional custodians of the land, and seek their permission to enter their territory.

Smoking Ceremony

The smoking ceremony is an ancient ritual conducted by Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Native plants believed to have cleansing properties are smoked to ward off evil spirits and bad omens. The ceremony serves both as a way to welcome you to country but is also an important way to get rid of the bad energy and welcome the good energy at the same time.
