Plenary Session

Monday's plenary talk by Clifford Surko was about antimatter. He opened with an overview of the matter/antimatter symmetry problem—that our best theories predict that there should be equal amounts of matter and antimatter in the universe, which there clearly isn't.

Antimatter studies has applications for astrophysics, medicine and materials characterisation. (Although unfortunately, we shouldn't expect antimatter propulsion any time soon).

Clifford also discussed challenges of producing and trapping antimatter so that it can be studied, and the breadth of research which has been conducted to date. He focussed both on what has already been achieved, and what might be next.
